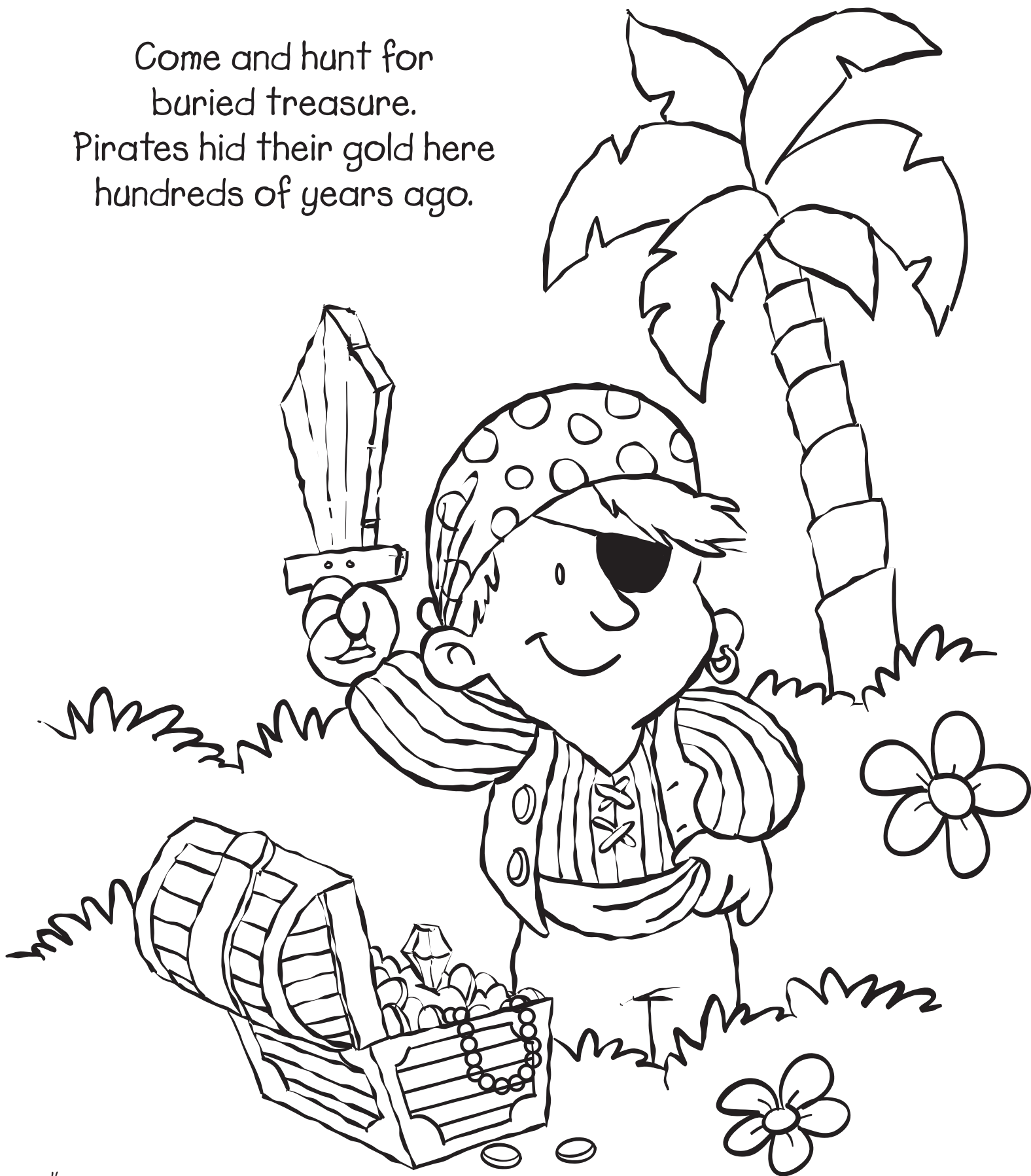


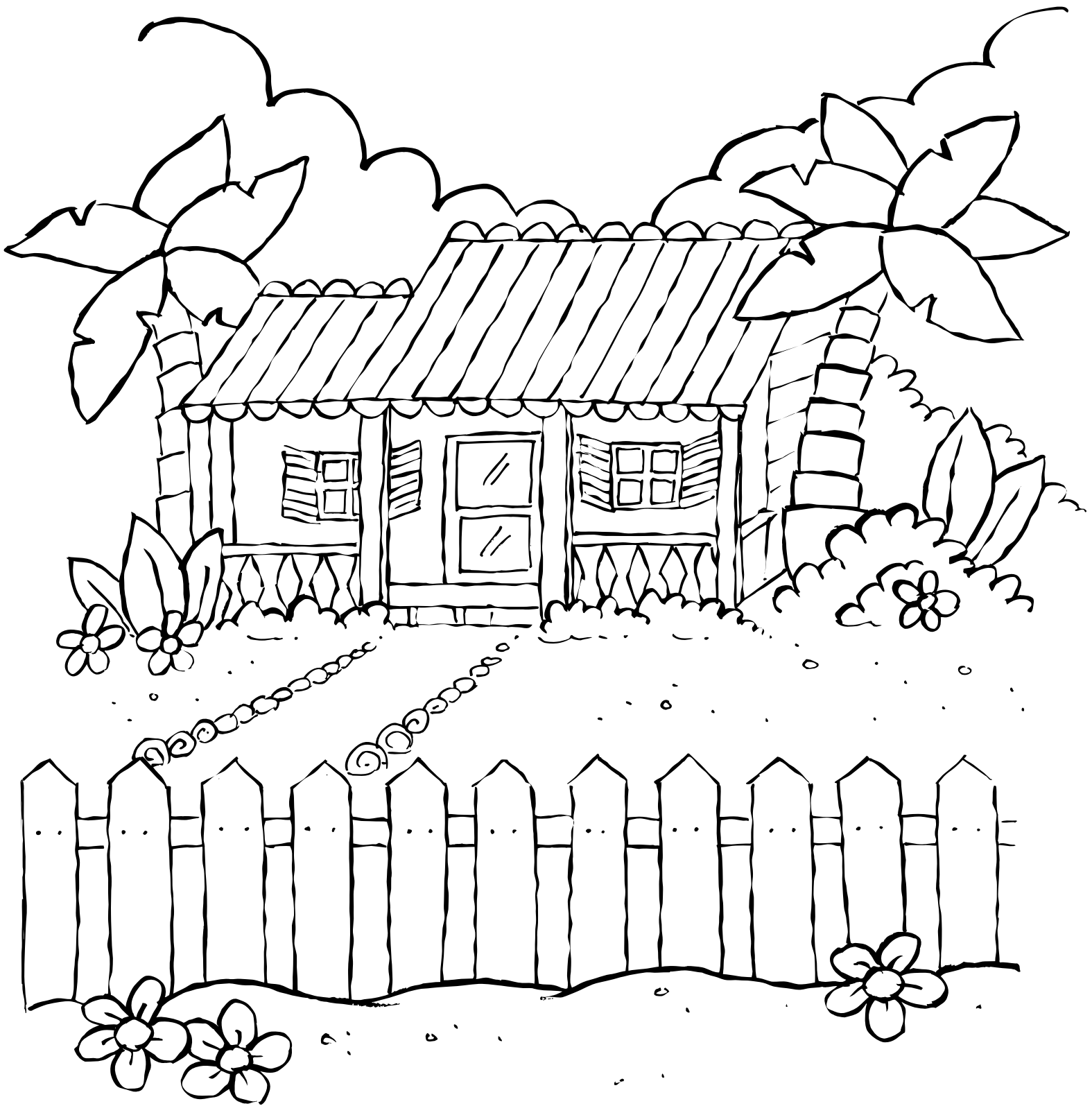
Welcome to the Cayman Islands



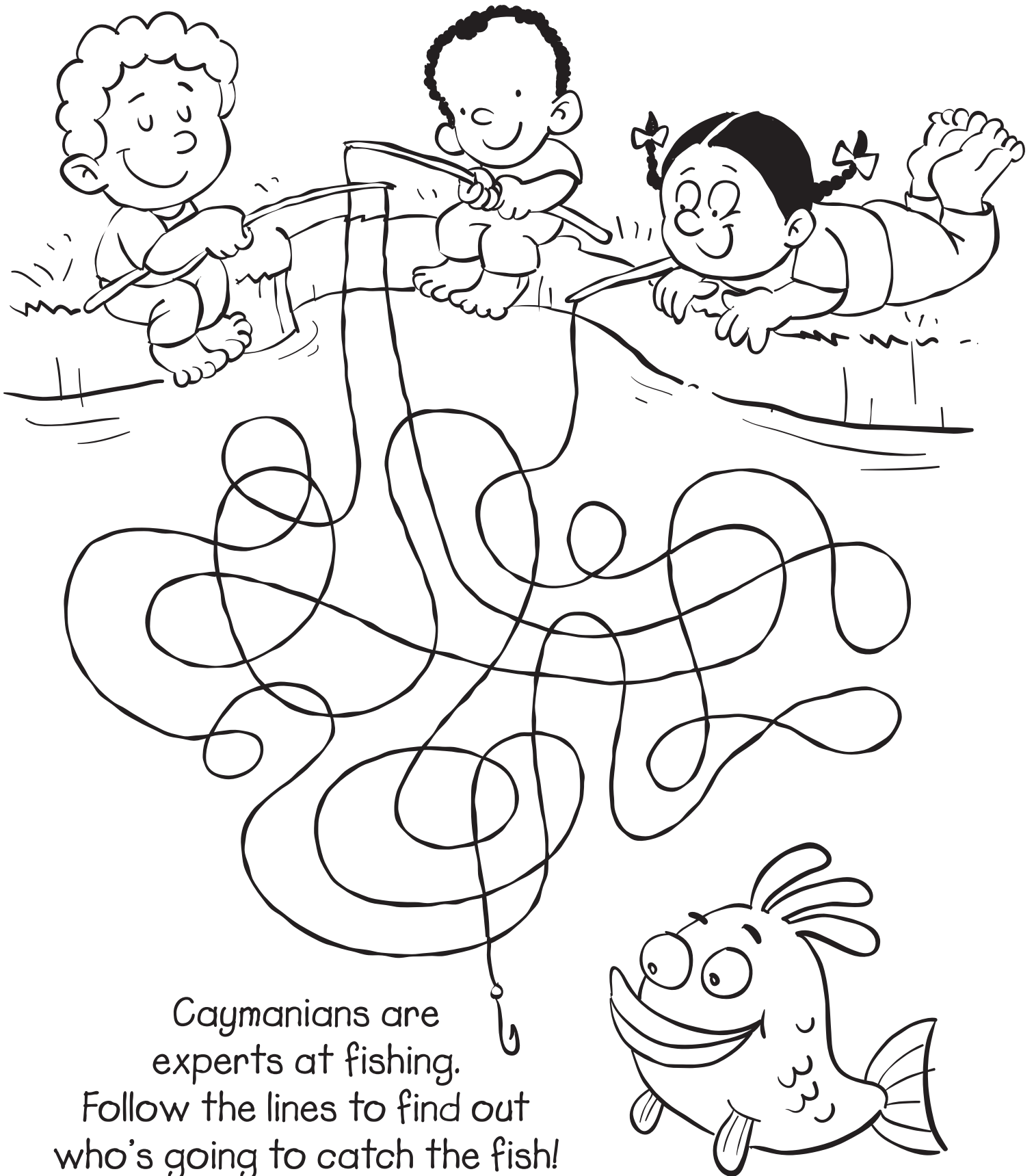

hundreds of years ago.



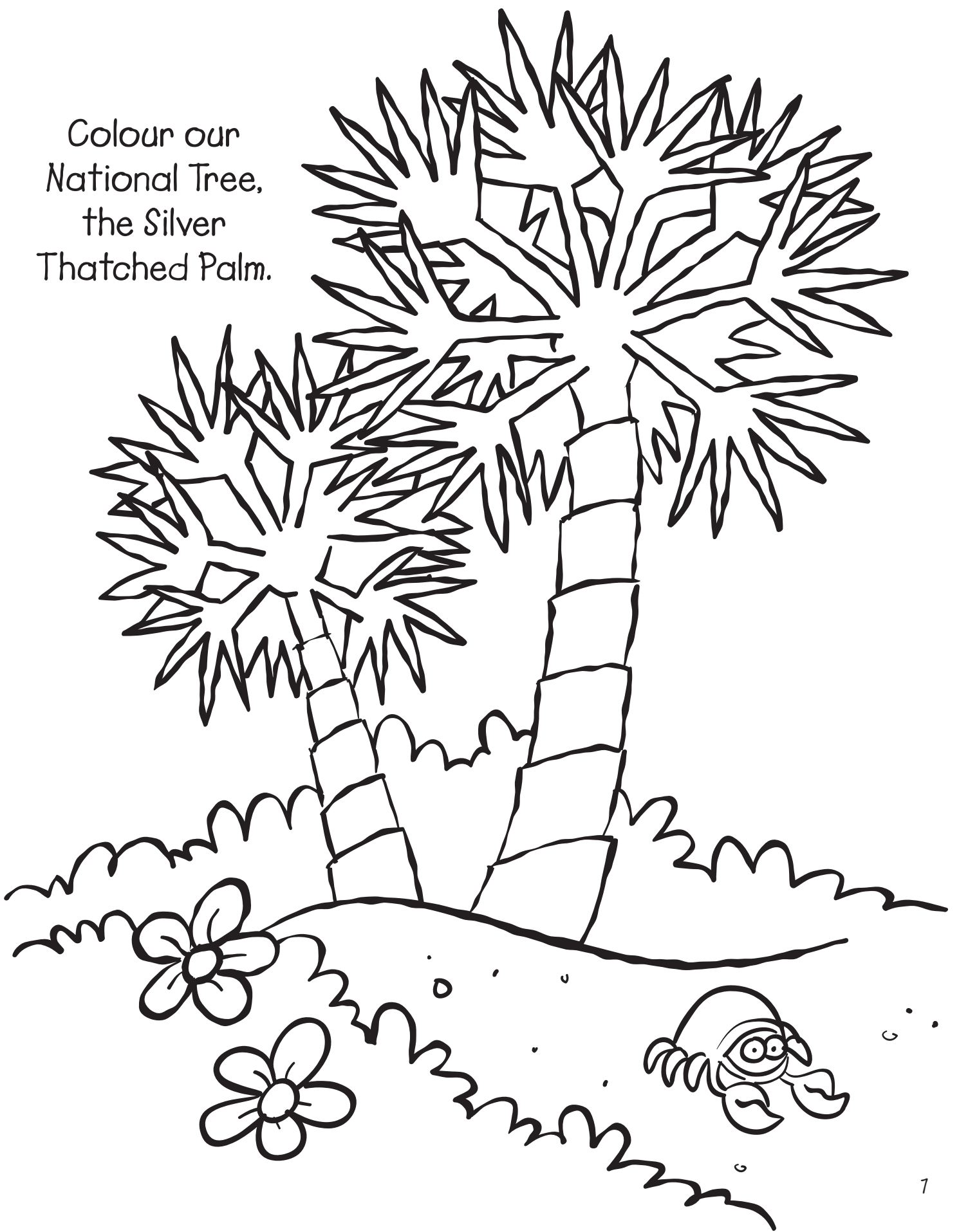


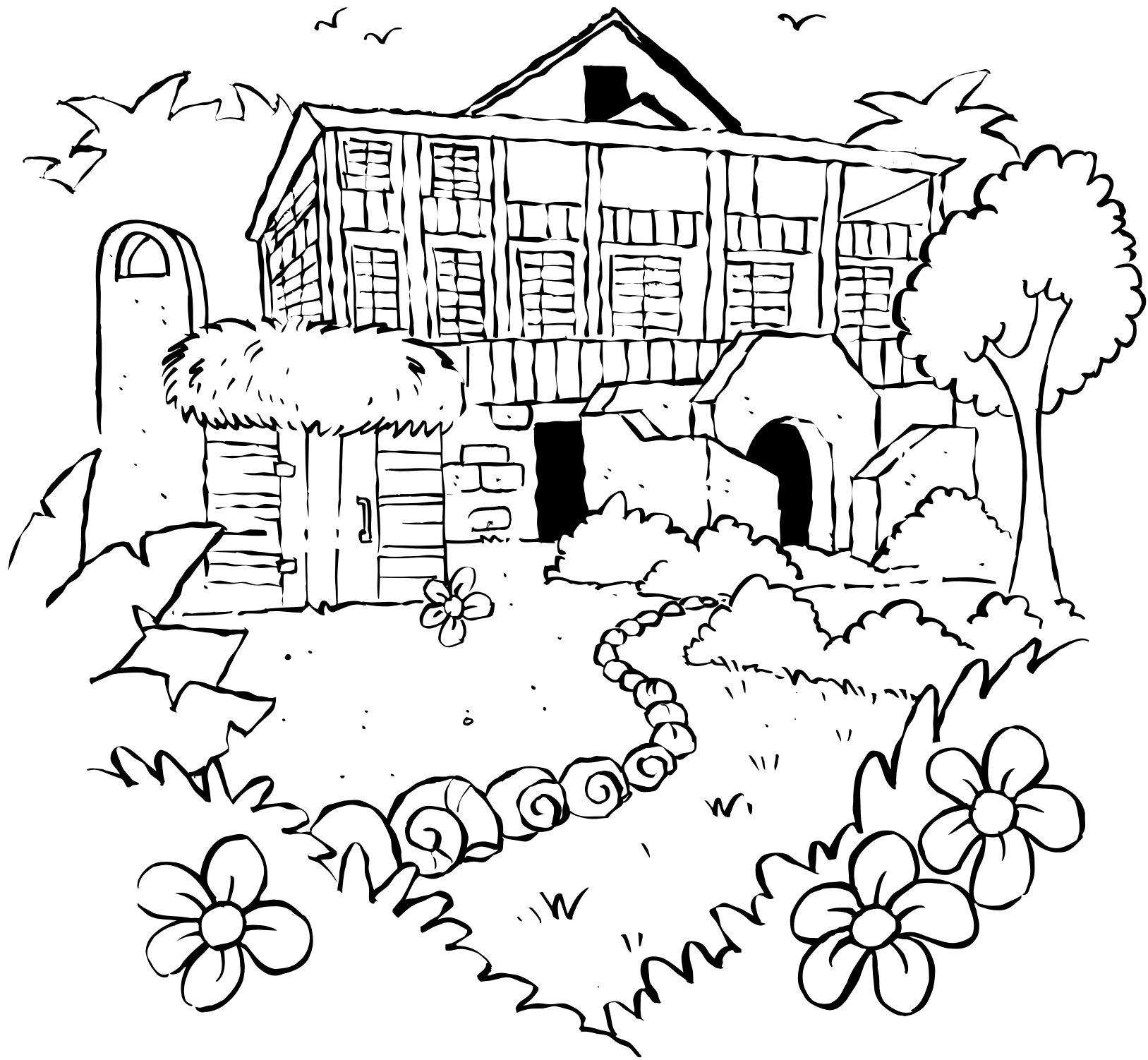
What makes our traditional Cayman homes so cheerful?

and colourful picket fences.



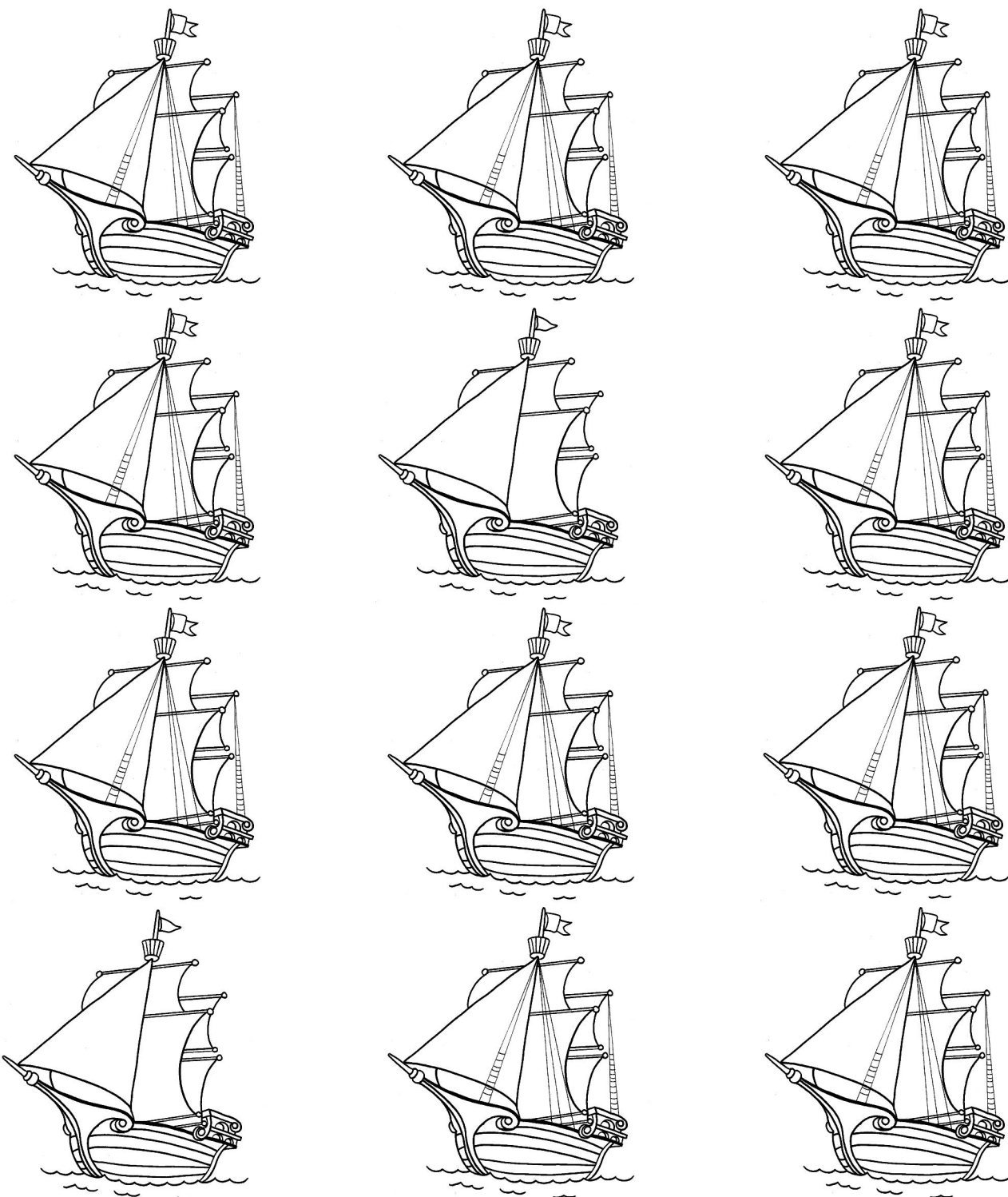
Caymanians are

Thatched Palm.

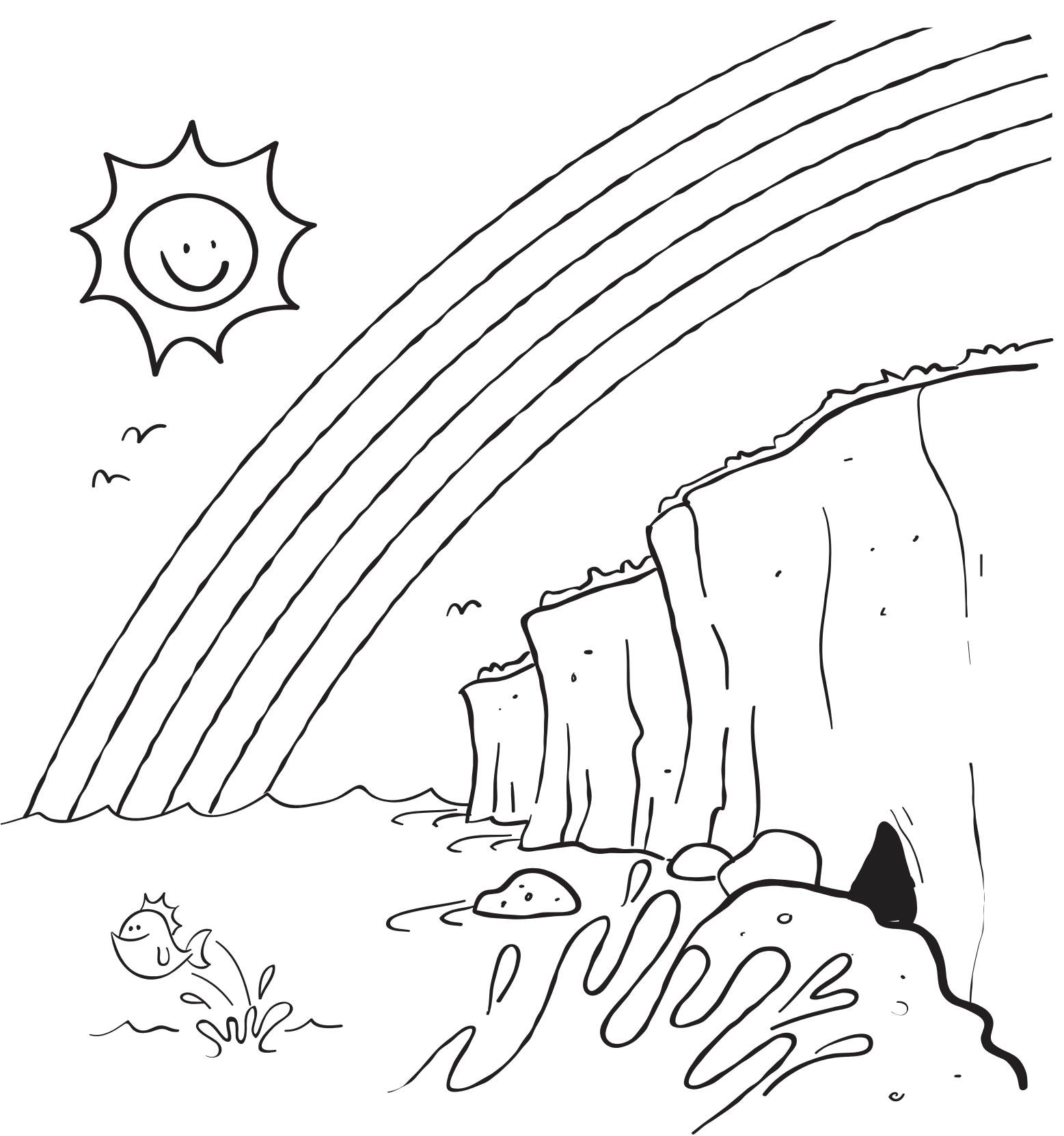




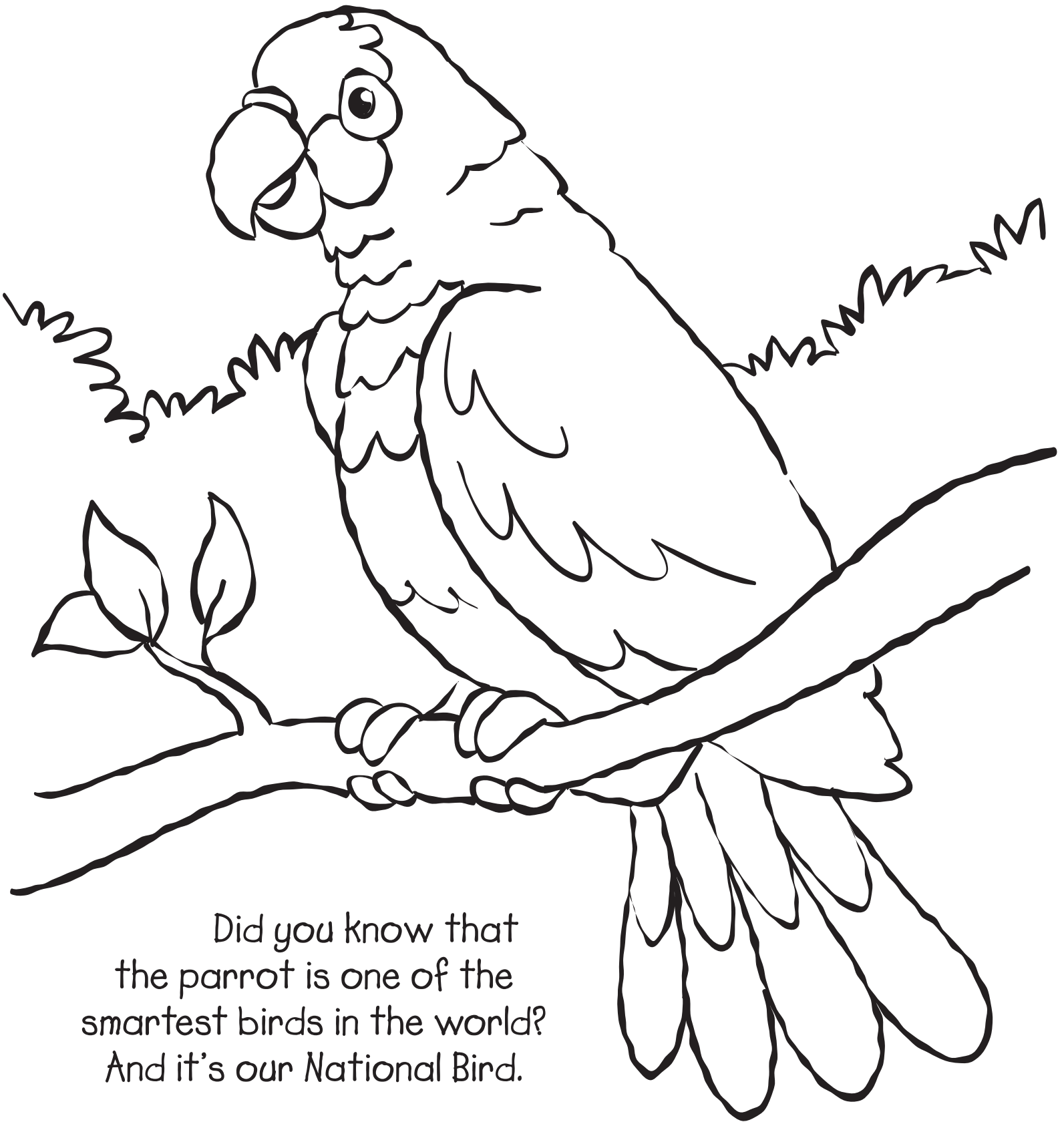
Pedro St. James was the first "great house" built of stone in the Cayman Islands.

Can you find the 10 ships that are alike?



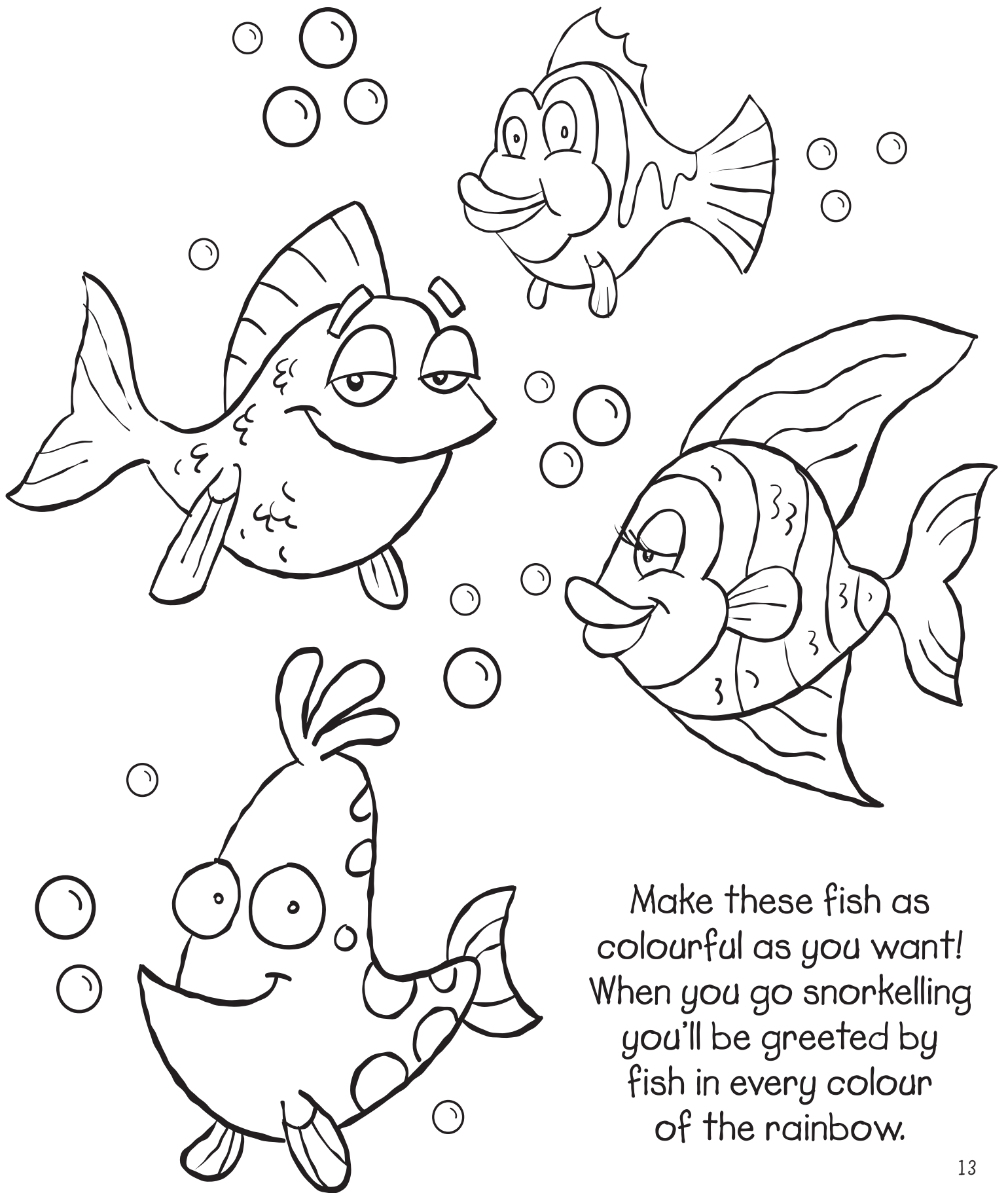
The bluffs on Cayman Brac are dotted with old pirate's caves.



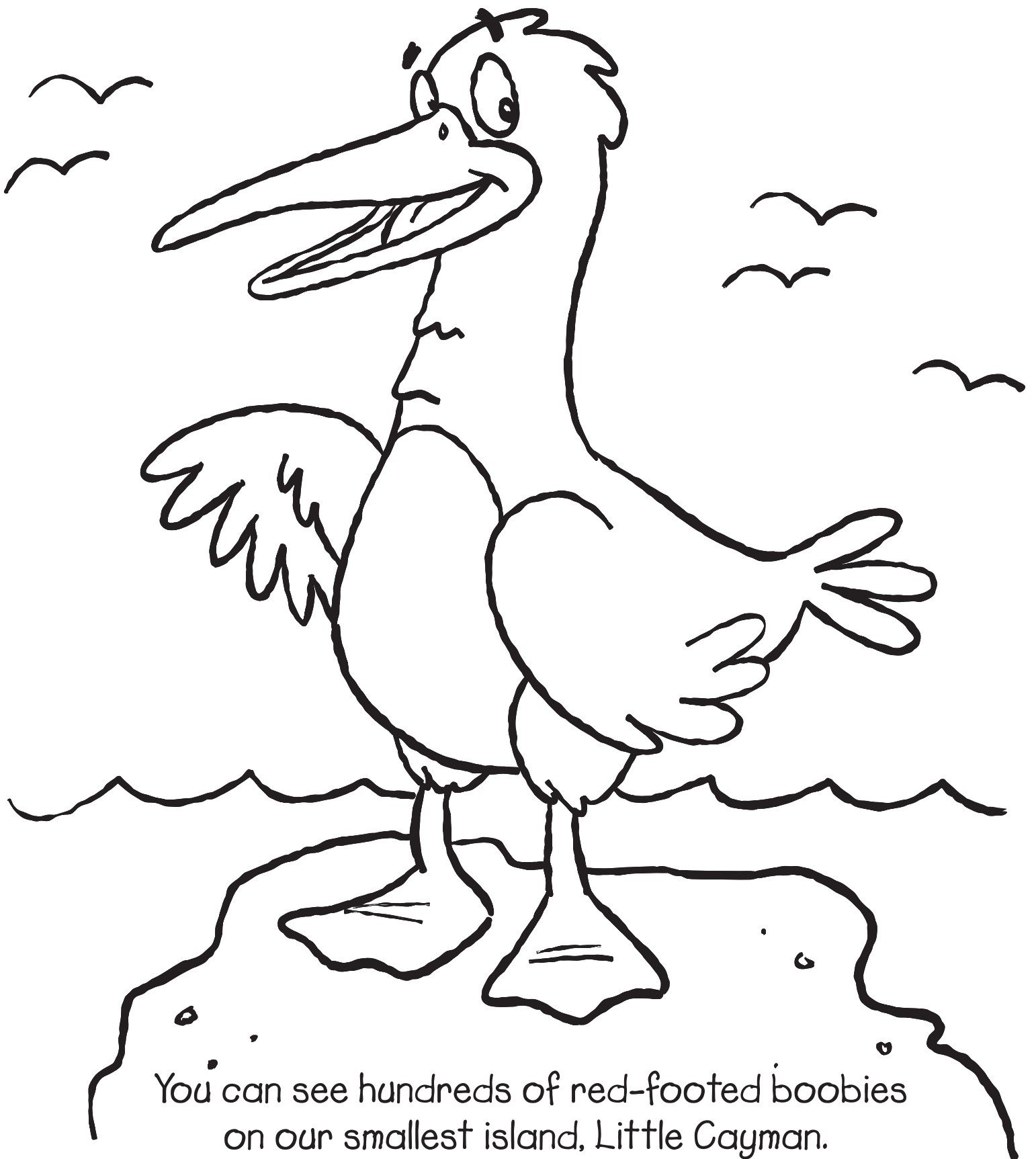
Did you know that

One of the world's oldest creatures calls Little Cayman home. Connect the dots and see who he is.

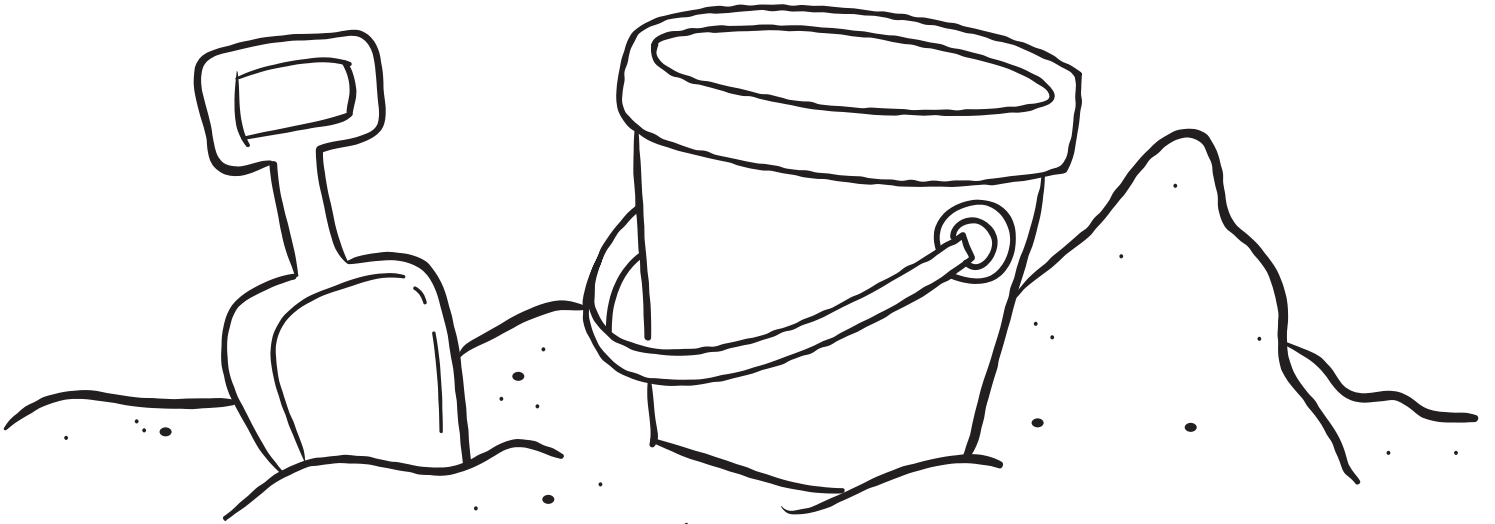




Make these fish as

of the rainbow.



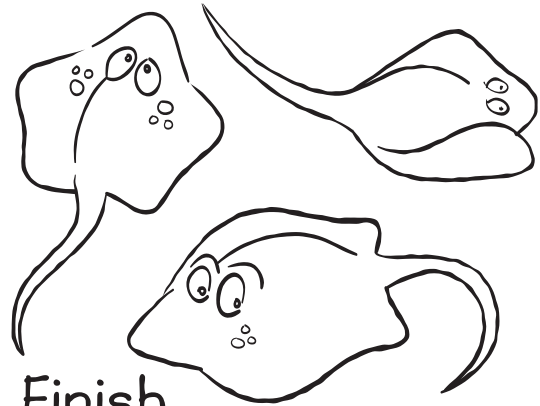
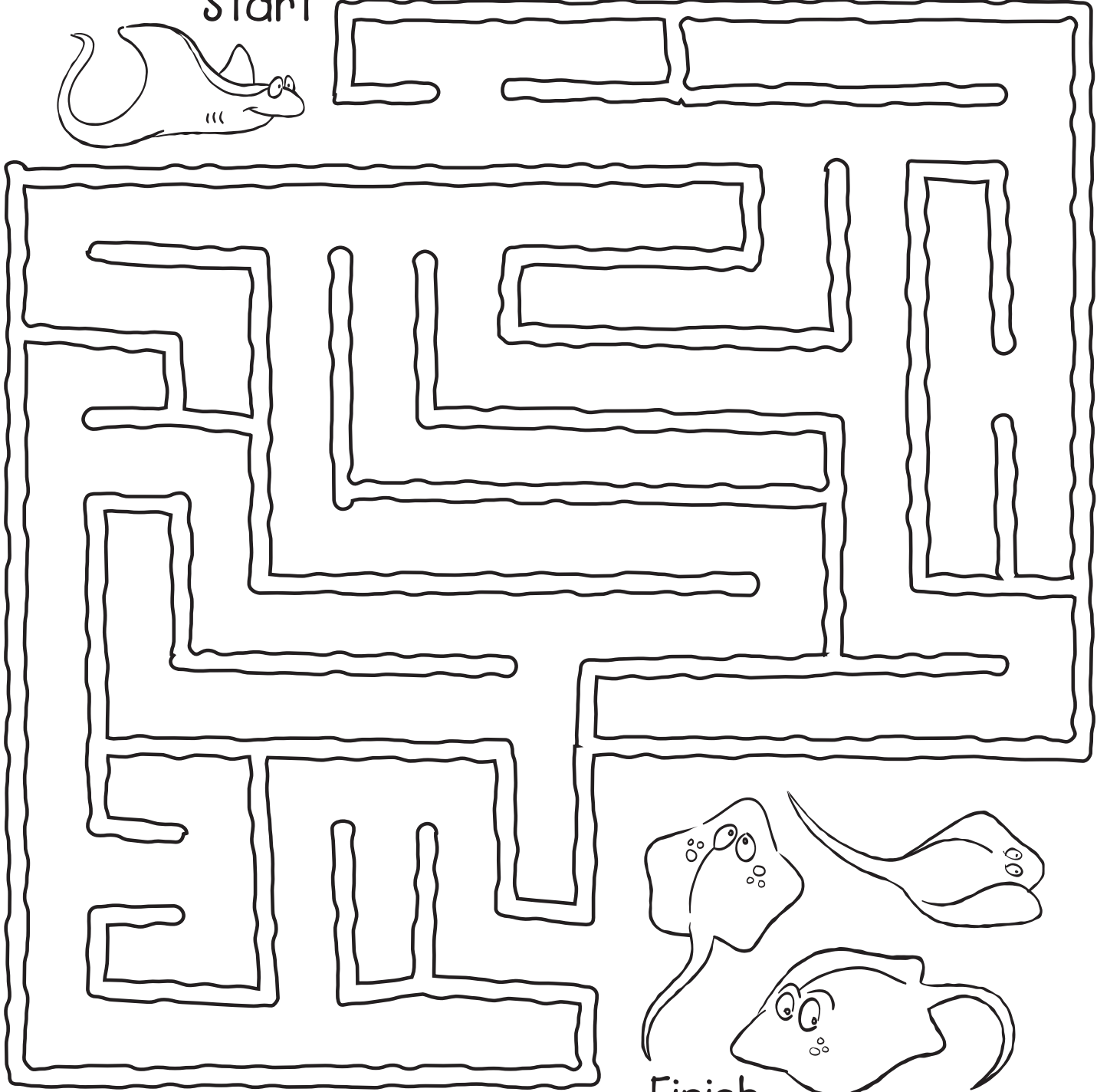
You can see hundreds of red-footed boobies

made of rosemary.

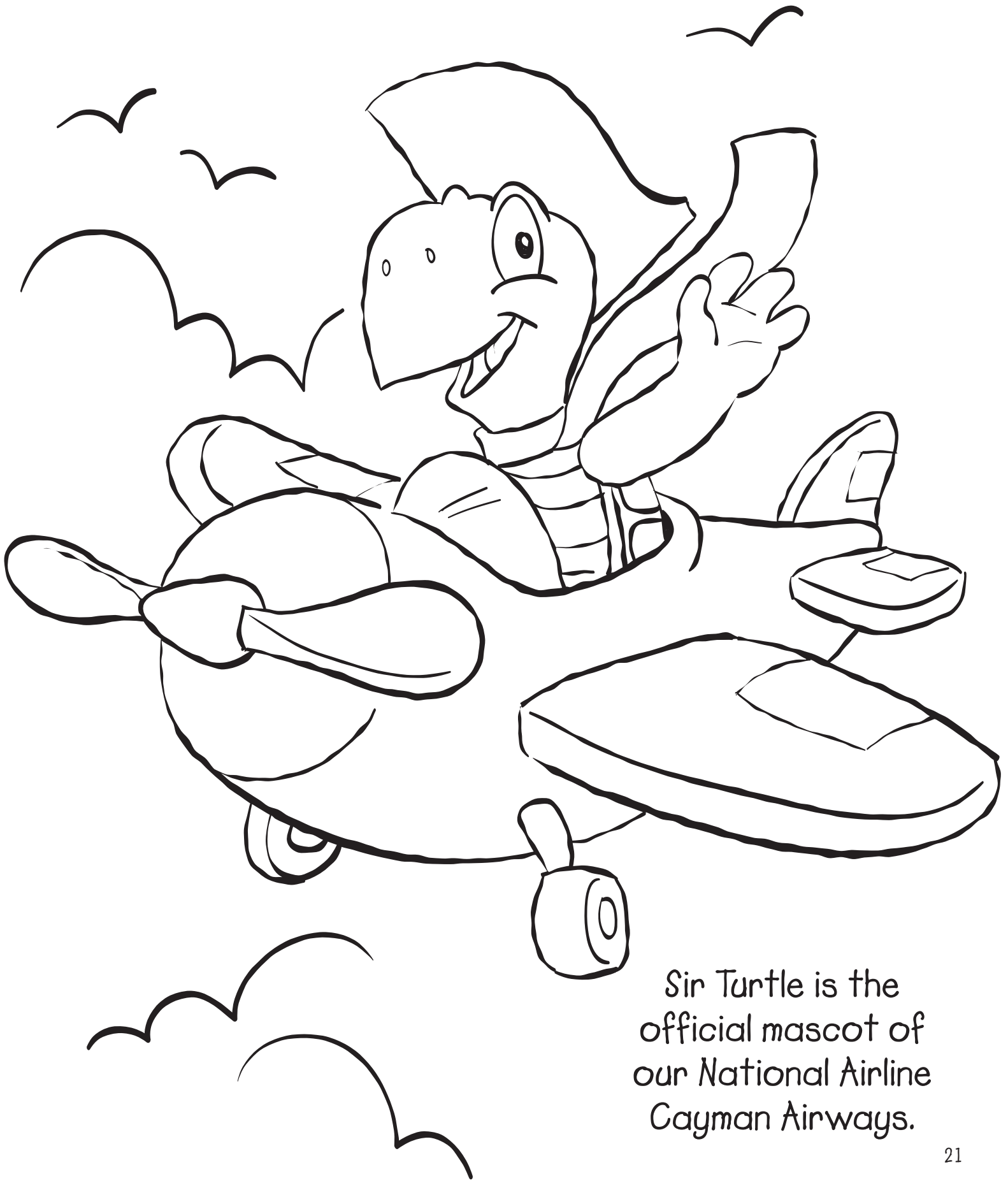

Cassandra Hibbert was born right here in the Cayman Islands and remembers being told tales of Cayman at home and in school.

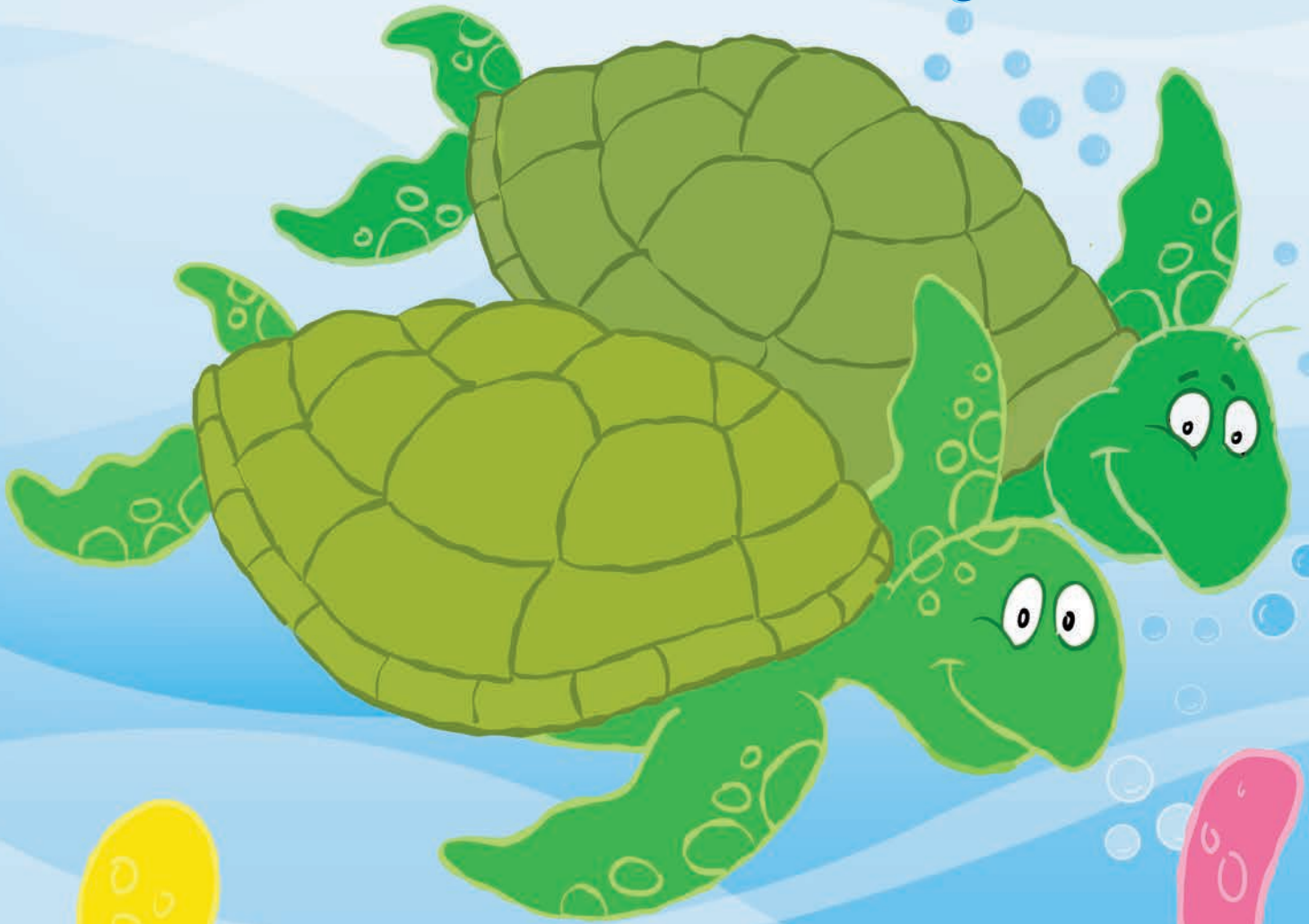
Cassandra was proud of her history and wanted to find a way to share her home and its culture with others, especially children, in ways that would be both fun and exciting.
